## WHAT'S HAPPENING NOW:

### • Farmers are mostly finished with harvest. Yields were very good this year with a minimal number of rain days.

- Nearly all of the cover crop acres should be planted by now and are getting good moisture.
- This moisture will be helping the overwintering cover crops germinate and grow heading into late fall. We had a hot and dry start to the cover crop season but the weather pattern has shifted to cooler and wetter now.

#### Practical Farmers of Iowa Cover Crop Cost Share

Cover Crop enrollment started in June and enrollment goes through December 2nd, 2024. This year farmers have the option of a \$10 or \$15/ac payment rate. This program is stackable with federal and state cost share programs. We've signed up about 35,000 acres so far in the Lower Cedar Watershed.

#### **Field Day Update**

September 5th, we had a soil erosion reduction workshop with the folks up at South Valley Farms, Mt. Vernon, IA. Conservation Manager, Ruth McCabe, presented on her findings from traveling to other grain producing countries. We also had a rainfall simulator presentation, cover crop equipment on display, and a drone cover crop application. We had about 60 in attendance.





Thank you for your partnership in making it possible for us to work with farmers to adopt conservation practices in the Lower Cedar Watershed. We are very excited to see the progress that will happen over the next few years!
